High School Profile

Established in 1959 as an independent, coeducational day school, AIS offers an American/international educational program from Pre-school through Grade 12 for students of all nationalities. The students are children of the diplomatic corps and other international organizations, as well as the business and Austrian communities.

Within the rich cultural context of Austria, AIS Vienna:

- Nurtures an inclusive learning community
- Challenges students to strive for personal excellence and to explore their passions
- Fosters respect through compassion for others and our world.

AIS educators are thinking coaches. They are academically and pedagogically accomplished. They do not simply provide superior instruction; they lead, inspire, and excite. They find true delight in teaching and are committed to igniting the potential in every student. AIS High School educators average over 15 years in the classroom, 65% are from the United States, 77% hold advanced degrees, 4 hold doctorates, and 42% have been at AIS for 10 years or more.

The High School offers an enriched international university preparatory program. Instruction is in English, with English as an Additional Language course offerings and support systems where required. The International Baccalaureate Diploma and/or the AIS Austrian Matura equivalency may be earned in addition to and with more requirements than the U.S. Diploma.

Classes are seventy-five to eighty minutes in length and meet on an eight-day rotation. There are four academic periods per day and students take a maximum of eight courses per semester. (Some IB courses meet additional times during the week.) One credit is earned per full year course; one half-credit is earned for half-year courses.

TRANSCRIPT INFORMATION

International Baccalaureate courses are indicated by "IB". IB classes are awarded an additional 0.33 in the GPA calculation: IB Math Studies SL I is not weighted. Language courses at the Intermediate B and C levels are weighted. The GPA calculation is based on a four point scale. All courses are calculated in the GPA except those graded on a Pass/Fail basis.
